It is easy to forget just how much has been achieved in over ten years. Labour has fought for you in all parts of the community, and here are some of the highlights:

For Horsham's workers

- ☐ Introduced the National. Minimum Wage and increased it to £5.52 per hour.
- Dads now get paternity leave of two weeks for the first time.
- ☐ All full-time workers now have a right to four weeks' paid holiday.
- ☐ Improved rights for contract workers.

For Horsham's health

- □ NHS funding trebled since 1997.
- 85,000 more nurses and 32,000 more doctors nationally, so improving services in our hospitals.
- Waiting times for operations halved...
- ☐ Cancer death rates down by 12 per cent, saving 43,000 lives.
- NHS Direct offering free, convenient patient advice.

For Horsham's children

- ☐ Three new children's centres locally
- ☐ Free nursery places for three- and four-year-olds
- ☐ Waiting times for operations halved..
- ☐ Child benefit up 26 per cent and Child Tax Credit, giving more money to parents.
- ☐ The creation of Sure Start to help children from low income families



For Horsham's older residents

- ☐ Free eye tests for over-60s.
- ☐ Free local bus travel for over-60s
- £200 winter fuel payments to pensioners and up to £300 for over-80s.
- ☐ Free TV licences for over-75s.

For education in Horsham

- ☐ Record levels of literacy and numeracy in schools.
- ☐ Funding for every pupil has doubled.
- ☐ Record numbers of students in higher education.
- Over 30,000 more teachers in schools.



Other achievements of which we are proud include:

☐ Gift Aid worth £625 million to charities last year. ☐ The negotiation of the Good Friday Agreement. ☐ The introduction of civil partnerships and the scrapping of Section 28. 15 per cent on Black Wednesday. The ban on fox hunting ☐ Free entry to national museums and art galleries ☐ The investment in over a million social homes to bring them up to standard without doubt, a better and fairer place. ☐ The Open University. Set up by Harold Wilson's government and this year celebrating forty years of delivering first class distance learning to thousands of students over the next few weeks. 


It is easy to forget what it was like in the years before 1997 under the Tories - the NHS on its knees, schools crumbling, crime doubled and interest rates still recovering from hitting
